Sometimes we express our values in the form of **good intentions**.

2020 has been like a giant, super-bright light bulb. It's showing us the good, the bad, and the ugly about ourselves and our culture. And under the light, we're faced with a question:

## Do we live out the values we say we believe in?

### **Matthew 25:31-46 NIV**

[31] When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his glorious throne. [32] All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. [33] He will put the sheep on his right and the goats on his left.

[34] Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. [35] For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, [36] I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.'

[37] "Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? [38] When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? [39] When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?' [40] "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me.'

[41] "Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. [42] For I was hungry and you gave me nothing to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, [43] I was a stranger and you did not invite me in, I needed clothes and you did not clothe me, I was sick and in prison and you did not look after me.'

[44] "They also will answer, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or needing clothes or sick or in prison, and did not help you?' [45] "He will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me.' [46] "Then they will go away to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life. "

Remember watching "FAIL" videos? I always wanted to yell at the TV,  
**"Put down the camera and do something!"**

I believe Jesus challenges us in this passage in that kind of way.

- Put down your opinions and DO something!
- Put down your rituals and rules and DO something!
- Put down your self-importance and DO something!

So... what are **WE** doing?

- We're addressing lostness by sending families to unreached people groups.
- We're addressing food insecurity through our For The Love food truck.
- We're helping men in transition and recovery through Souls Harbor.
- We're helping women transition out of the system through Saving Grace.
- We're partnering with a local school to feed and serve families.
- We're having meaningful conversations about racial justice.
